Currently, we are implementing the **9th Country Programme (2020-2025)** in selected districts of 9 Regions (Afar, Amhara, Benishangul-Gumuz, Gambella, Oromia, Sidama, Southern Nations, Nationalities and Peoples, Somali, Tigray, and Addis Ababa City Administration) with a total budget of USD 112 million.



Achievements (2020 - 2024)

Reproductive Health

UNFPA partners with the Government of Ethiopia to strengthen comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services, ensuring the availability of essential health commodities. UNFPA procures approximately one-third of the country's public contraceptive supply and supports efforts to bridge human resource gaps in maternal health through capacity-building programs such as Integrated Emergency Surgery and Obstetrics and Accelerated Midwifery Training.


