UNFPA, the United Nations Agency for Sexual and Reproductive Health, began its development assistance in Ethiopia in 1973. Currently, we are implementing the **9th Country Programme (2020-2025)** in selected districts of 9 Regions (Afar, Amhara, Benishangul-Gumuz, Gambella, Oromia, Sidama, Southern Nations, Nationalities and Peoples, Somali, Tigray, and Addis Ababa City Administration) with a total budget of USD 112 million.

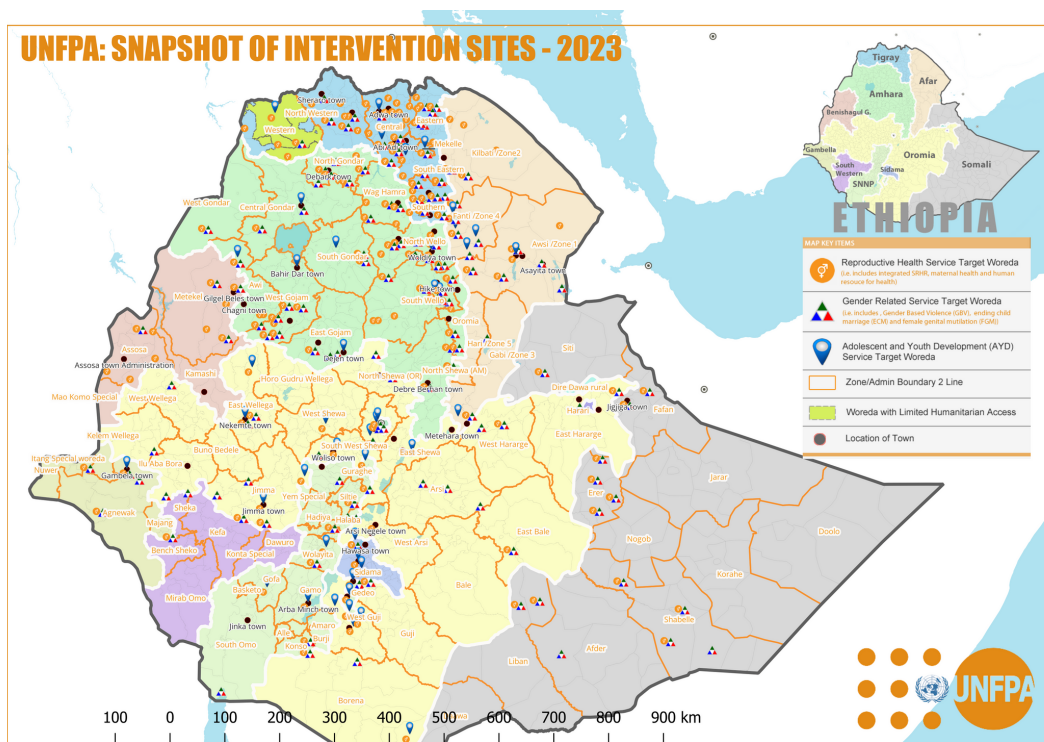

Achievements (2020 - 2023)

Reproductive Health

UNFPA partners with the Government of Ethiopia to ensure comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services, including ensuring the availability of necessary health commodities. UNFPA procures about 1/3 of Ethiopia's public contraceptive requirements and supports the government's efforts to address the gap in human resources for maternal health through capacity-building programs like Integrated Emergency Surgery and Obstetrics and Accelerated Midwifery.
