

OUR VISION & STRATEGIES AT A GLANCE

UNFPA in Ethiopia aims to achieve the following:

- 1. Reduced maternal deaths and unplanned pregnancies and increased access to clinical care for rape survivors through the delivery of the Minimum Initial Service Package for Sexual and Reproductive Health in emergencies (MISP); successful transitions from minimum to comprehensive SRH services, and to more resilient health systems in Ethiopia.
- 2.Reduced rates of GBV, through prevention actions aimed at sustainably transforming discriminatory gender norms; mitigation of GBV risk through improved security, dignity, and mobility of women and girls and across all sectors of humanitarian response; and mitigation of life-threatening impact and long-term recovery promotion through better quality services by meeting the GBV Minimum Standards in Emergencies.
- 3. Increased resilience in high-risk locations of the country through reduced humanitarian needs, speedier recovery and more robust local delivery systems that serve women and girls as well as young people and contribute to sustainable development objectives.
- 4. Reduced levels of inter-communal violence, rebuilt social cohesion based on increased trust, confidence and positive interaction between conflict-impacted regions among young people.

OUR MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS

1. GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE PREVENTION AND RESPONSE



199,477

Women and girls reached with multi-sectoral GBV services across 8 affected regions



99,612

Women and girls reached with mental health and psychosocial support (MHPPS) services

- 6,887 individuals supported with comprehensive GBV services by 32 UNFPA-supported One Stop Centers in Ethiopia
- 191,037 persons benefitted by integrated services at 40 UNFPA Women and Girls' Friendly Spaces
- **10 Safe Houses supported** in Amhara (2), B/Gumuz (2), Somali (1), Tigray (2), Sidama (1), Oromia (1) regions, and Addis Ababa (1) city administration.
- **351 GBV service providers trained** on GBV minimum standards, case management, ethical GBV data collection, prevention and social behavior change.

OUR MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS

2. SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH & RIGHTS



317,933

Women and surrounding host communities provided with maternal care and sexual and reproductive health services by 212 deployed midwives and 13 Maternal Health and Nutrition Teams (MHNT) in affected regions.

- **121,724 individuals** reached with GBV/SRH awareness raising activities through mobile community outreach teams and door-to-door campaigns.
- 70,609 persons reached with STI/HIV counseling and treatment in affected regions
- **53,619 pregnant and lactating mothers screened** from malnutrition and provided with nutritional supplements to prevent complications during pregnancy and childbirth.
- 13 Mobile Health Teams deployed in Amhara (4), B/Gumuz (7), Somali (2) regions, including 398 midwives and health extensions workers to support SRH implementation in affected regions.
- **345 health professionals trained** on Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (BEmONC), Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP), family planning, HIV/STI, among others.
